Time Commitment:



Working Conditions:

The work environment is typically agreeable at work site both within residential setting as well as outside and may require working under the following conditions: dealing with potentially disagreeable participants.

Role Purpose Summary:

To provide specific residents, as directed by the Volunteer Coordinator, with basic mending, minor alterations and sewing of garments



Key Accountabilities:

- Basic mending, minor alterations and sewing of garments as per residents' requests (weekly)
- Keep track of receipts for materials used/needed and present to Volunteer Coordinator on a monthly basis
- Assist with program evaluation, if applicable

Qualifications:

- Good, clear communication skills in the English language with special emphasis on listening and observation skills and verbal communication
- Ability to follow through with direction
- Positive attitude, fun personality, and willingness to help others, flexibility
- Basic sewing skills, including ability to hem, patch, repair, shorten, lengthen, etc., personal items of new and/or worn clothing
- Access to and willingness to bring own sewing machine/serger necessary, work to be completed in the onsite Volunteer Room
- Ability to interact with residents by providing encouragement, direction, and demonstrating patience
- Comfortable working in a group setting
- Familiarity with Geriatrics and/or vulnerable populations (addictions, mental health, homelessness) an asset
- Police Information Check with Vulnerable Sector Check mandatory for this position
